In addition to the curricula for the individual academic subjects outlined in the following pages, students in Lower Sixth also have one lesson of PSHE, three lessons of Games per week and an Enrichment Lecture. Students completing an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) also have a double lesson with their supervisor.
