- Year 7, 8 and 9 homework for Latin, Music and Design & Technology is set fortnightly.
- In addition to the one English homework a week set in Year 9, students are expected to spend 20 minutes per weekday reading their accelerated reader text. They are also expected to have their accelerated reader text with them at all times whilst at school.
- In addition to the stated Science homework, the school uses a piece of software called Tassomai. Students should aim to complete their 'daily goal' on a daily basis; however, they must complete it 3 times a week to avoid a lunchtime catch up session.
